It all began with.....Palm Beach volunteer firefighter, Jessie, was on his way to a meeting when he noticed what he thought was a dead dog lying on the side of the road. Like everyone else, he drove by, but **UNLIKE** everyone else, his conscience told him to turn around to check on the dog. The 6 -7 month old pit bull terrier mix was indeed alive and lifted his head. The dog, later named Hagen after Hagen Ranch Road where he was found in Boynton Beach, was taken to Sue S., a Stray No More volunteer. Upon assessing the condition of the dog, Sue found he was severely emaciated (actually a walking skeleton) dehydrated, anemic, covered in what appeared to be bite marks and scratches from other dogs, was full of fleas and missing much of his fur. The amazing thing about this little guy, even when he was so close to death was his remarkable spirit. He loves people, even though it was people that abused, neglected, and eventually abandoned him to the streets to die.

After one year of living in a Stray No More foster home, Hagen has been nursed back to health. He is one and half years old, neutered, house trained, and loves to get in bed with you and watch T.V. at night. He truly loves people, nice female dogs, and CATS! He also is a lap dog that wants to give you kisses. He is energetic, and enjoys riding in the car, and boat. (with life vest) We refer to him as **HAPPY, HEALTHY, HUGGIN, HAGEN!** He is a miracle rescue and we are thankful to God for having Hagen turn out to be such a great pet.
